FCRE AWARDS SEVEN SCHOLARSHIPS

Fairfax County Retired Educators gives scholarships to deserving Fairfax County Public Schools graduating seniors. We are fortunate to see these young people go into our profession to which we devoted most of our lives.

FCRE is able to give seven \$2000 scholarships through our umbrella organization, the W. Harold Ford Scholarship Foundation. Various organizations, families and friends have donated to the W. Harold Ford Scholarship Foundation.

This year we have the following seven scholarships to award:

1. The Mary O. Ambler Scholarship. The Mary O. Ambler Trust was established in 1944 by the estate of Mary Ambler who was a teacher at Fairfax High School. The scholarship is to go to a girl.
2. The Herbert Grady Carpenter Scholarship is given by the Apple Federal Credit Union. Herbert Carpenter was a long time teacher in Fairfax County.
3. The FCRE Scholarship is given by our organization to a graduating FCPS student.
4. The Harriet B. Mika Memorial Scholarship is given in memory of an outstanding history teacher at W. T. Woodson High School and is funded by her family and friends.
5. and 6. The Bobbi Vest Trust funds two scholarships. These scholarships were established in her memory by family and friends. Bobbi Vest was a reading teacher in Fairfax County for many years.

7. Finally, the W. Harold Ford Scholarship, named for an outstanding FCPS administrator, is funded by donations to FCRE and proceeds from our December sales event. This scholarship is only awarded when FCRE raises sufficient funds. We are happy to be able to award this scholarship this year.

The winners are:

Emily Cooper (nee Colon), a 2012 graduate of West Springfield High School and four time recipient of a W. Harold Ford Scholarship. Emily will be a senior at Virginia Tech next year. She is newly married and plans to get her Master's Degree in Elementary Education at Tech on an accelerated program. Over the years, Emily has been heavily involved in teaching, tutoring, and mentoring. Her interests lie with disadvantaged and marginalized children at the elementary level. Because of her interest, Emily traveled to Malawi, Africa in order to learn first hand about another culture. Through all her involvement in helping others, Emily has maintained a 3.96 average. Emily will receive the *Mary O. Ambler Scholarship* again this year.

Rebecca Edmiston is a 2015 graduate of Lake Braddock Secondary School. Rebecca plans to go to Liberty University and to study to be a music teacher. Rebecca believes that listening to the classical composers such as Beethoven, Brahms, Tchaikovsky, Bach, and Mozart at a young age allows children to develop greater appreciation for music along with a better attention span and listening skills. The elementary music specialist she works with spoke of Rebecca's flexibility when plans change suddenly. The teacher also commented on Rebecca's insight, her positive attitude, and her compassion for her students. Rebecca is already aware of the various learning styles students by her participation and teaching in the **Teachers For Tomorrow Program**. The Scholarship Committee was so pleased to be able to award her the *FCRE Scholarship* named for our organization.

Tess Jacobson is graduating from Herndon High School this June and will be attending James Madison University. Tess is interested in special education and has chosen courses to prepare for teaching in this field. She volunteered many, many hours over the summer at Camp Victory, a camp for disabled and special needs children. She also volunteers as a riding assistant at a therapeutic riding school for disabled and special needs children. In addition to these activities, Tess plays in the symphonic orchestra, plays field hockey, and participates in Latin Conventions. We are so happy to award Tess the *Harriet B. Mika Memorial Scholarship* in memory of an outstanding teacher in Fairfax County Public Schools.

Colleen Mulrooney is an IB Diploma Candidate with a 4.40 GPA. Colleen graduates this June from Robinson Secondary School and then will go to The College of William and Mary in the fall. She plans to become a teacher of Mandarin Chinese. She has twice studied abroad in China and received the 2014-2015 Robinson Secondary Excellence in Language Award. Through her experiences with Model United Nations, Colleen made lesson plans and activities for the Model United Nations meetings. She learned that students do not always respond as anticipated so that adaptability and flexibility are important components of teaching. She was a founding member of the Chinese Honor Society and President of the Model United Nations Team which doubled in size under her leadership. We are so happy to award one of the *Bobbi Vest Memorial Scholarships*. Bobbi Vest was a teacher in Fairfax County Public Schools and a valued Board member of FCRE.

Huyenan (Anee) Nguyen is another of our scholarship winners bound for William and Mary in the fall. She will graduate from Oakton High School this June. Because of a schedule conflict she is taking French V after school. Anee is also a teaching assistant for an Advanced Placement English Teacher. In addition to being an accomplished pianist, she is an award winner on the Debate Team. Anee has the Girl Scout Gold Award, which is equivalent to the Eagle Scout Award in the Boy Scouts. Her tutoring has taught her that kindness, patience and dedication are important qualities in teaching. We are so happy to award Anee one of the *Bobbi Vest Memorial Scholarships* made possible by the family and friends of Bobbi Vest.

Sandra Richie has won a W. Harold Ford Scholarship for three years. Sandra graduated from James Madison High School and now attends James Madison University. Thanks to an extra credit project for her first education class, Sandra became interested in learning disabilities and in particular, ADHD. She plans to incorporate this research into her Honors Senior Thesis Paper. Another interest Sandra has is the connection between psychology and the environment. She has begun to study the use of nature therapy to help students with learning disabilities and behavioral issues. Sandra will go to Malta and Italy this summer for hands on learning about this connection. We are pleased to award her the *Herbert Grady Carpenter Memorial Scholarship* generously funded by the Apple Federal Credit Union.

Ianne Sherry graduates from Robinson Secondary School this June. She has not decided on where she will be going to college, but she has been accepted by the University of Virginia, William and Mary, Brown University, and Boston University. At Congregation Olam Tikvah, Ianne worked one on one with an autistic child to successfully help him prepare for his bar mitzvah. Additionally, she was the service leader for the kindergarten/first grade prayer program. The Director of Education at Olam Tikvah

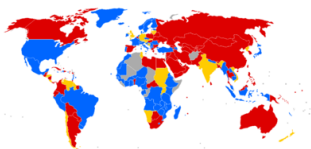

PUT KIDS FIRST

On Saturday, April 19, 2015, the **Virginia Education Association** and **PTA** co-hosted a rally in Richmond themed *Put Kids First*. The object of the mass gathering was to center the public's and lawmakers' attention on the Commonwealth's lawmakers not doing what they should to support public education. The **NEA** endorsed the rally by providing funds to bring forty busloads of teachers, family members, friends, and students to the state capital. Because of distance from Richmond, some of those busses left home between 5:30 and 6:00 am. **NOVA's** busses left about 10:00 am. By 1 pm, some 1000 plus participants had gathered in the Richmond Convention Center to receive instruction and free *Put Kids First* t-shirts to wear on the six block march. As they gathered strength, music played, children were read to, and speeches were made. At exactly 2 pm, with a police escort and music provided by the Radford High School Marching Band, the demonstrators took to the streets.

The length of the walk was not too much for a retiree, and the speeches on the Capitol grounds not too long. Later that night resting at home, I learned that Richmond's Channel 6 news reported on the "thousands" that took part in the rally and on the need demonstrators stressed for greater state funding of public education. The rally was definitely a success.

Retirees were part of it as they have been in the past and will be in the future. We still have lots of fight in us!♦

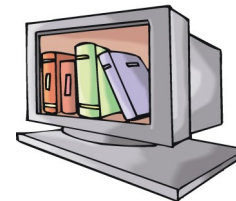
